The Company's primary activities are bulk earthworks, demolition, asbestos removal and aggregate supply, working within the wider construction industry in the south east of the UK.

We shall achieve these aims by adopting the following procedures:-

- Guarantee that all employees, regardless of grade or position, are paid in excess of the established minimum wage set for the UK and are free to leave their employment in accordance with their contracted terms of employment.
- Apply stringent vetting and assessment of our supply chain with respect to their compliance with the Modern Slavery Act.
- Encourage the reporting of concerns and provide protection of the identity of whistle blowers.
- Not knowingly support or deal with any business involved in slavery or human trafficking.
- Provide necessary training to relevant members of staff to meet the requirements established within this statement.
